Peter wrote this letter to believers who were dispersed throughout the area of Asia Minor (modern day Turkey) and who faced distress and suffering due to persecution. He wrote to encourage them to remain

faithful to Christ and to live according to His ways even during distress and hardship. The attributes that we see here in verse 8 – like-mindedness, sympathy, love for one another, compassion, and humility – are all found in Christ as He lived, suffered, and died for us.

As I reflect on the NCBN Fall Meeting that was held this past month, I believe our Network church messengers, members, and leaders were faithfully living out these attributes and walking in the ways of Christ even as we met together. We learned from one another during the breakout sessions on evangelism, scripture-led worship, leadership development, and highlights from the 2023 SBC Annual Meeting. We celebrated how God had worked through our Network churches to bless others by 1) awarding two scholarships from the newly named Dr. Larry Orange Equipping the Called Scholarship, and 2) raising funds to help Imran Manzoor and his family as they seek to remain in the US while providing online teaching and encouragement to Pakistani pastors. We read with gladness the reports from our Network Teams, ministry partners, and Salazar Scholarship recipients (please see pages 43-44 in the Book of Reports for these testimonies) We rejoiced in the addition of Iglesia Bautista de Crestwood to our Network of churches. And we worshipped together before the one true and living God who has called each of us to walk in faithful service to Jesus Christ.

I want to express how grateful I am to the Lord for each of our churches and pastors. Thank you for your encouragement, support, and participation at the Fall Semi-Annual Meeting! I also want to say thank you to all the folks who helped plan our meeting, and provided the leadership needed to bring it about. That list of people includes: Bro. Rick Davidson, Moderator and one of our breakout session leaders; Bro. Kevin Kimes, Assistant Moderator; Amanda Bruner, Network Ministry Assistant; Karen Kelly, Treasurer; Rick Durham, Administrative Team Leader; Bro. Philip Meade, Church Health & Leadership Team Leader and one of our breakout session leaders; Susan Bryant, WMU Team Leader; Bro. Christ Platt, Great Commission Team Leader and breakout session leader; Rodrigo Dias de Souza, breakout session leader; Bro. Jay Padgett, our worship leader for the service; and Bro. Paul Briscoe, our preacher for the worship service. I am thankful for each one of these servants of Christ for the way in which they serve the churches of our Network with wisdom and grace.

As I close, I want to leave you with a few updated numbers. After the service, Amanda registered a few more people bringing our final tally to 155 registered attendees from 35 churches. Breaking this number down a bit further, there were 22 pastors, 101 messengers, and 52 guests.

Please be sure to mark your 2024 calendar for next year's meetings. March 17 will be our Spring Semi-Annual Meeting and September 15 will be the Fall Semi-Annual Meeting.




